### Staying Put joins town seniors **Transportation Task Force**

Did you know that every day 10,000 more people turn 65? It's no secret that the American population is aging and people are living longer, healthier lives.

Today, the 3,000 seniors in New Canaan represent about 15% of the population and are expected to increase to 4,000 by 2030. Many of those who no longer wish to drive already take advantage of the town's transportation options including the Getabout, *Staying Put*, taxis, and even Uber. (See one of our volunteer drivers on the left.)

In order to determine how the town will address the increased need for transportation over the next decade, the New Canaan Community Foundation recently convened a Transportation Task Force. Participants include representatives from the Heath and Human Services Department, the Getabout, the First Selectman's Office, and Staying Put, represented by Board Member Carol Blauvelt, who is also an Advisor to SWCAA, the Southwestern Connecticut Agency on Aging.

"Our goal is to make sure that the town has the resources in place so all seniors can get where they need to go," says Carol.

# "Tip from Nic"



Each year, thousands of Americans fall at home. Check this list to make sure your home is safe from falls.

- ✔ Remove all throw rugs
- ✓ Tape lamp cords to floor or wall
- ✔ Keep stairs clear
- ✔ Fasten down stair carpet firmly
- ✓ Install handrails on both sides of stairs
- ✓ Keep most-used things on the lower shelves
- Use non-slip mat or strips on floor of tub or shower
- Put grab bars inside tub/shower and next to toilet
- ✓ Use brighter light bulbs
- ✓ Place night-lights on path to bathroom

Having a medical alert device will bring help in case you fall and can't get up. Stop by the office and ask Nic about some alert devices that have been vetted by our members.
